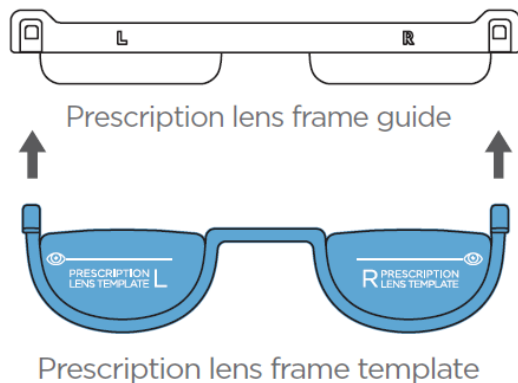

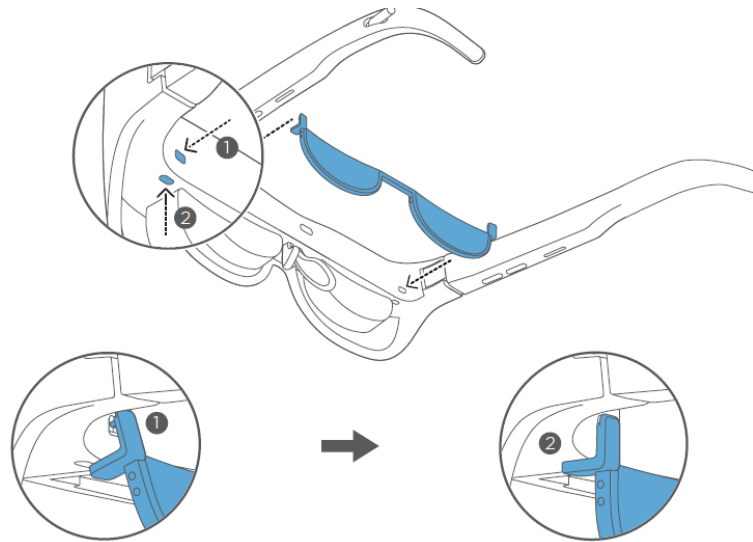
Legion Glasses - Customize your prescription lens

How to assemble the prescription lens?

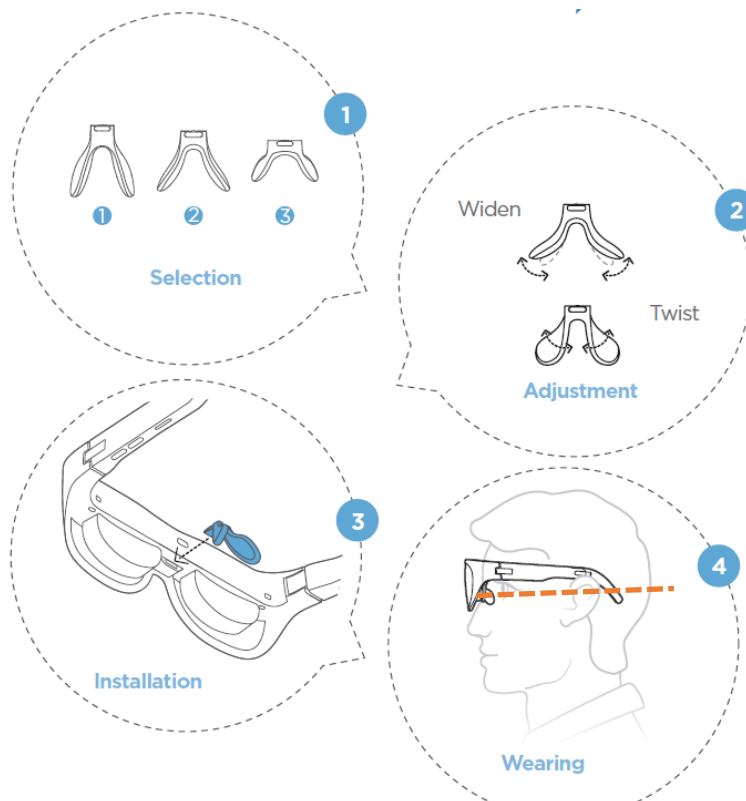


Fasten the snap at ① to the top slot

Gently tap the frame towards ② until it snaps tightly

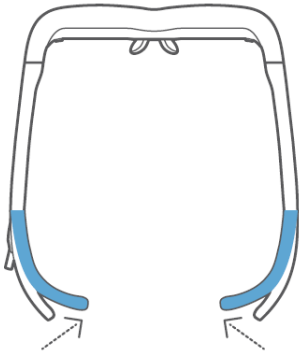
Legion Glasses - Select and adjust the nose pad

Select a nose pad and adjust its shape to get you the best view of virtual image in the glasses and keep the image in the center of your vision.

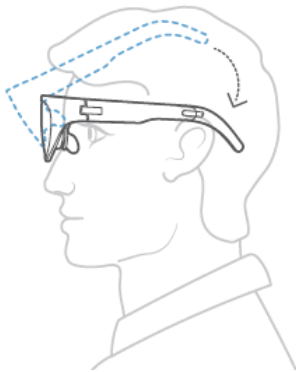


Legion Glasses - Adjustable temple and anti-slip adapter

Bend the ends of the temples inward to improve wearing stability.

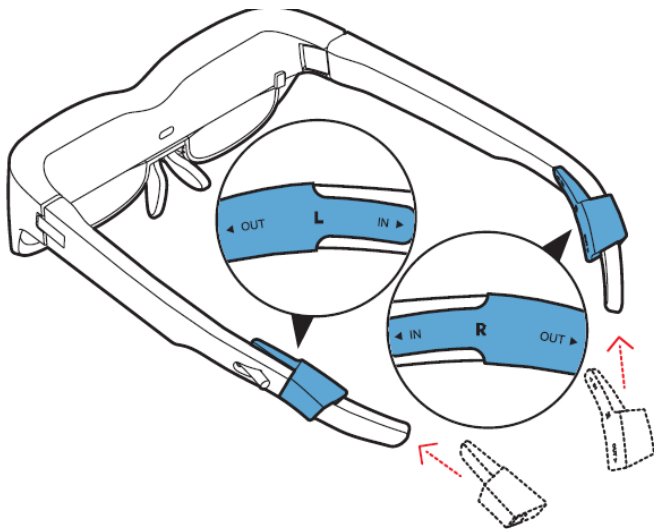


It is recommended to slide on the glasses from top to bottom.



The anti-slip adapters, in the accessories box, are designed for small or narrow head. The letters "L" and "R" marked on the anti-slip adapter represent left and right to make them easy to distinguish. Install the anti-slip adapters on the temples tightly with the "IN" sides facing the temples.

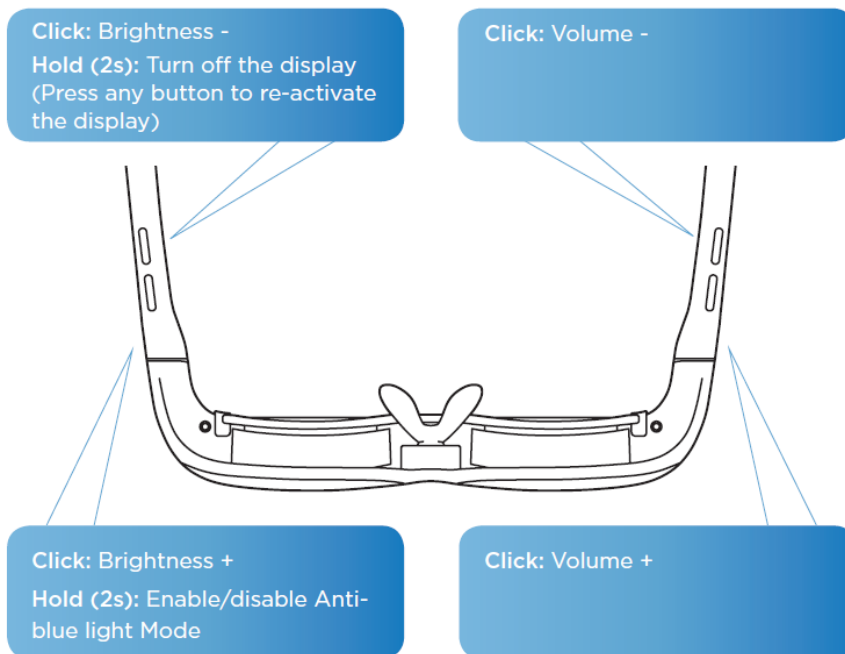
Legion Glasses - Speakers

- Audio speakers are built into each temple arm for a high-fidelity, open-ear experience.



Legion Glasses - Buttons and functions

- Short press:
 - Left temple arm: Screen brightness
 - Right temple arm: Volume level
- Long press:
 - Left front: Enable/Disable Anti-blue-light mode
 - Left rear: Screen blank



Connect Legion Glasses to Legion Go

Legion Go has two full functional USB-C connectors with DP out. Both connectors could be able to support Legion Glasses.

While we connect Legion Glasses to one of the USB-C ports, we can use the other USB-C port for charging.
